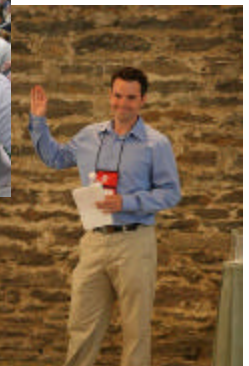

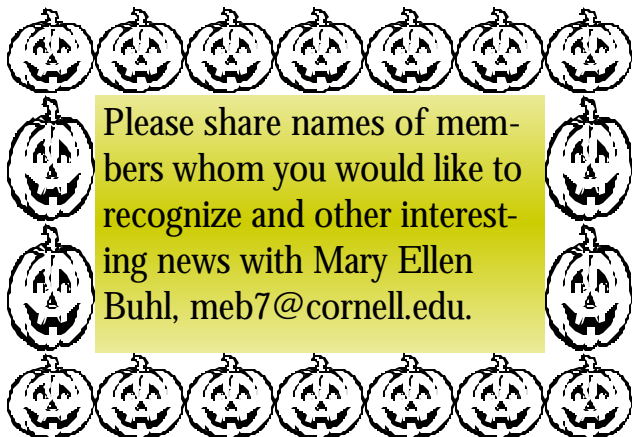

Perhaps, ironically, we are experiencing many of the same overwhelming, anxious feelings associated with a new environment that our students are facing. For example, seniors who are preparing to enter the world of work or graduate school approach that next step with much excitement as well as trepidation and uncertainty. Will I be well received? Will I be competent enough? What will my relationships be like with my colleagues?

How do we encourage our students to handle these transitions from college to the "real world"? As new professionals, we must learn to walk the talk and translate the advice we give students to advice suitable for our own career transitions. This might include words of wisdom such as:

- ? setting realistic goals and expectations of ourselves

- ? forming relationships across campus
- ? not being afraid to ask questions
- ? learning from our students
- ? being adaptable to our ever-changing schedules!
- ? giving ourselves time to play

The list could go on and on! The point is we need to model the guidance we provide to our students. To become comfortable and confident in our new roles, we must give ourselves permission to learn and to grow.
